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REPORT OF CURRICULUM FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2016-2017

Feedback on curriculum planning, implementation and evaluation for the academic year 2016-17 was obtained from students, teachers, external teachers, CNO of parent hospital and other professionals by the representative class coordinators in the month of August 2017. The relevant findings on analysis were:

a) Curriculum feedback by students

- 60% of the students rated curriculum and syllabus of the course as Good,
 42% as Excellent, while 18% rated Average
- 2. Majority of the students rated Good coverage of syllabus in the class while 17% rated Average.
- 3. Course delivery by faculty members were rated as Excellent by 45%, Good by 40% and Average by 15% of students.
- 4. Majority of the students rated teaching learning process as Excellent (47%) while 45% rated Good and 8% rated Average.
- 5. 53% of the students rated fairness in evaluation process as Excellent, 40% as Good and 7% as Average.

b) <u>Curriculum feedback - Teachers</u>

- 1. Majority (87%) of the teachers rated the syllabus as suitable to subject while 6% disagreed.
- 2. 73% of the faculty rated syllabus as need based.
- 3. 87% pointed that the aims and objectives of the syllabus are well defined.
- 4. Most of the faculty (87%) stated that the course content has corresponding reference materials.

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ACTION TAKEN REPORT

The findings of curriculum feedback were discussed in the curriculum committee by the principal and remedial action planned and communicated to faculty were

- a) Detailed syllabus orientation in the beginning of course by subject coordinators.
- b) Periodic evaluation of syllabus coverage by class coordinators.
- c) Uniform evaluation criteria to be followed for all student activities.
- d) Recommendation for purchase of reference books.
- e) Programs to improve communication and IPR skills.
- f) Clinical coordinator to ensure adequate training and guidance.
- g) Training for first years B.Sc. Nursing students on "Infection Control Practices".
