

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Women health refers to the branch of medicine that focuses on the treatment and diagnosis of diseases and conditions that affect a woman's physical and emotional well being. The health of women is of particular concern because in many societies they are disadvantaged by discrimination rooted in socio cultural factors. Women are more prone than men to experience anxiety, depression and somatic complaints. Because women represent the cornerstone of a family's overall health, ensuring they have access to quality care also can lead to improved health for children and families.
