Report of field visits of Third year B.Sc. Nursing (2016 batch) 2019-2020

1. Report on field visit to Special School

As part of third year B.Sc. Nursing psychiatric posting an observation visit was organized to school for mentally retarded children Perumbilavu on 22/2/2019 at 1.45 pm to orient the students regarding the services rendered by the institute, care and rehabilitation of mentally retarded children, components of special education and the problems faced by mentally retarded children. The group spend almost 1 hour with the children interacting with them and engaging in activities like games, dance and songs. The group returned back to college at 4 pm





2. Report on field visit to Special School Irinjalakkuda

A field visit was organized for third year B.Sc. Nursing students to school for mentally retarded children, Pratheeksha Bhavan at Pariyaram, Irijalakkuda on 5/8/2019 from 9.30 - 12.30 pm as part of their mental health nursing posting. An orientation session was arranged for the group by the head of the institute on the organizational set up, staffing pattern, philosophy of the institution, services rendered by the institution, future plans and activities and responsibilities of rehabilitation. Students also had interactive sessions with the children

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Report of field visits Second year B.Sc. Nursing (2017 batch) 2019-2020

1. Report on field visit to Pasteurization Plant

As part of community health positing second year B.Sc. Nursing students had a visit to pasteurization center- Milma on 26 July 2019. Students were given an orientation by the farm manager on various aspects like the organizational set up of the dairy farm, sources of milk, different methods to detect micro organisms, methods of purification of milk, process of pasteurization, tests used to check the efficiency of pasteurized milk and the role of medical professional in the farm. Community nursing faculty accompanied the students. Students were given opportunity to observe all the process there and buy products from the farm. The group returned back to college by 1 pm.

2. Report on field visit to Slaughter House

As part of Community Health Practical's 50 students of B.Sc. Nursing 2017 batch visited the slaughter house at Kuriachira on 27 July 2019 accompanied by the community health nursing faculty from Amala College of Nursing. The group were given orientation regarding the staffing pattern, structure of slaughter house, standards maintained, the process maintained for meat inspection, disposal of waste management and methods of transportation of meat to various areas. Students were given opportunity to observe the process carried out. The group returned to college by 12.30 pm and submitted the report on 28 July 2019.


3. Report on field visit to Water Purification Plant Peechi

An observation visit was organized to water purification plant at Peechi for second year B.Sc. Nursing students to meet the requirements of their curriculum on 19 July 2019. The group started from Amala at 9 am and reached Peechi by 10 am. The assistant engineer at the plant oriented the students regarding the staffing pattern, the components of water purification system, various techniques of storing water, filtration process, process of disinfection and role of health care professionals at the plant. Students were given time to watch around the plant and returned back to college by 2 pm.



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4. Report on field visit to PHC

A field trip was organized for second year B.Sc. Nursing students to Primary Health Center Elavally as part of their community health nursing practical's on 22/7/2019. An orientation was given by the nurse in charge on the staffing pattern, infrastructure, activities and functioning of PHC, cold chain and its maintenance and the vaccination procedures followed. The students observed the clinical areas and returned to college by 12.30 pm.




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5. Report on field visit to Community Health Center

As part of community health nursing posting, second year nursing students had an observation visit to community health center Mullassery on 25/7/2019 accompanied by the community health nursing faculty. Students were given an orientation by the CMO on the physical layout, functions and various activities, records and reports, family welfare programmes and roles and responsibilities of community health workers. Students were also given opportunity to acquaint with the functioning of CHC through a 3 days postings in groups in the following days.







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3. Report on field visit to Old Age Home

As part of mental health nursing posting students of third year B.Sc. Nursing had a field visit to St. Josephs old age home, Pullazhi on 16/8/2019. The group reached the center by 10.30 am. An orientation was given to the students by the in charge of the institution. It is a charitable institution run by the coordinated work of nuns of Thrissur Dioses. It serves as a residential home for the aged, the infirm and destitute women of the society devoid of any discrimination of caste and creed. The students were also oriented regarding the organizational set up, staffing pattern, philosophy of the institution, source of income, services rendered and role of HCP. The group interacted with the inmates and returned back by 12.30 pm.

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4. Report on field visit to terminally ill patients

Third year B.Sc. Nursing students of Amala College of Nursing had a field visit to Providence Home Marthakkara on 20/8/2019. The visit was arranged to this institution run to care terminally ill patients who are not cared by family and relatives to orient the students regarding the organizational set up, staffing pattern, functions and services and role of HCP. Students were given opportunity to observe the care given to terminally ill and engage in the activities. The group returned back to college by 3 pm.

1. Report on field visit to Leprosy Hospital

2. Report on field visit to District TB Center


